The report brings together feedback and data from voluntary, community and social enterprise organisations operating across Warwickshire following its survey in 2017.

The report explores key areas such as workforce, income, expenditure and relationships. It is a valuable resource for not only the VCSE Sector but also public and private sector partners.

"Organisations with an income of less than £100,000 per year make up 56% of the VCSE Sector in Warwickshire; this compares to 82% nationally when looking at NCVO data".
